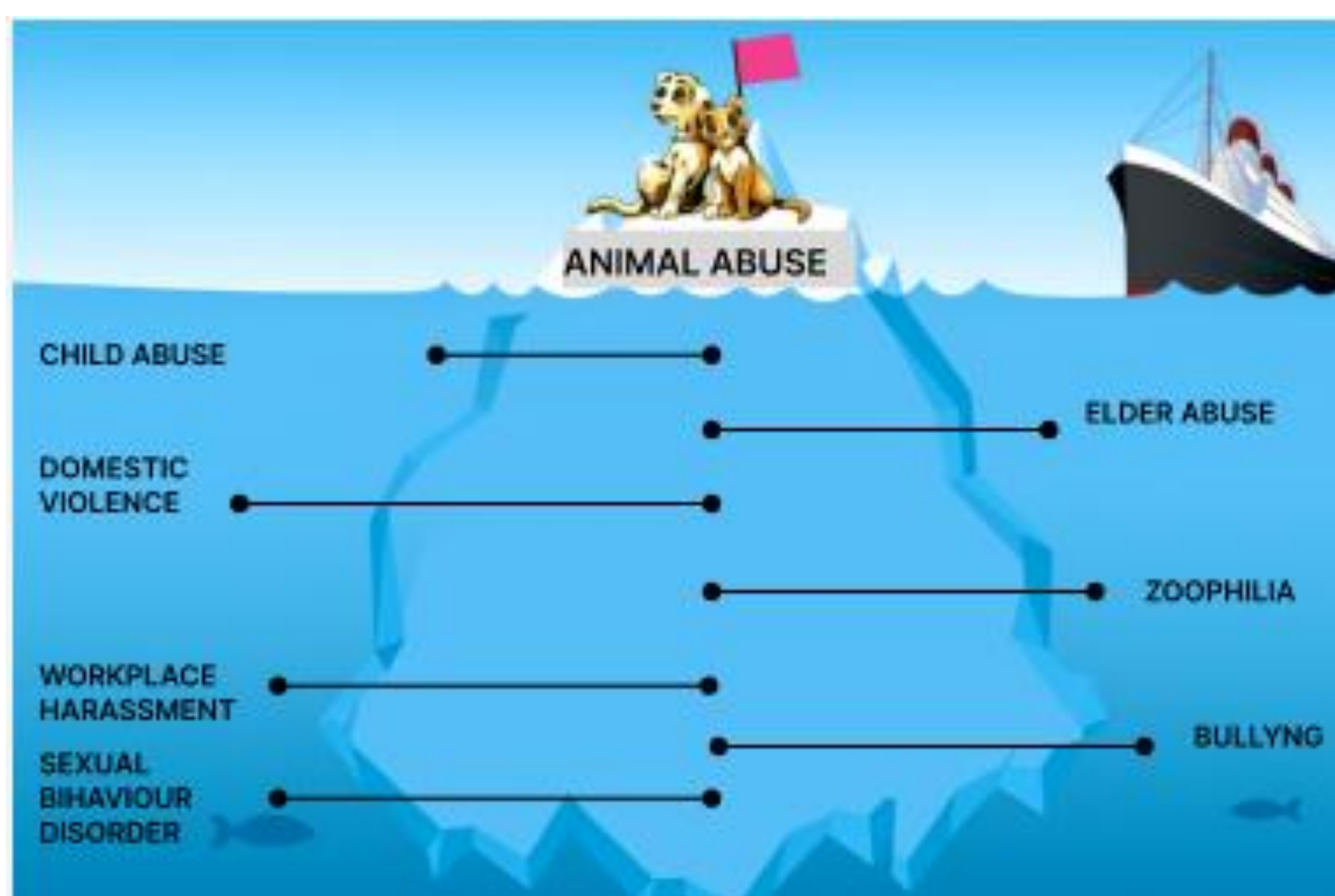

- Assesses the interest of the public in a new animal abuse reporting system

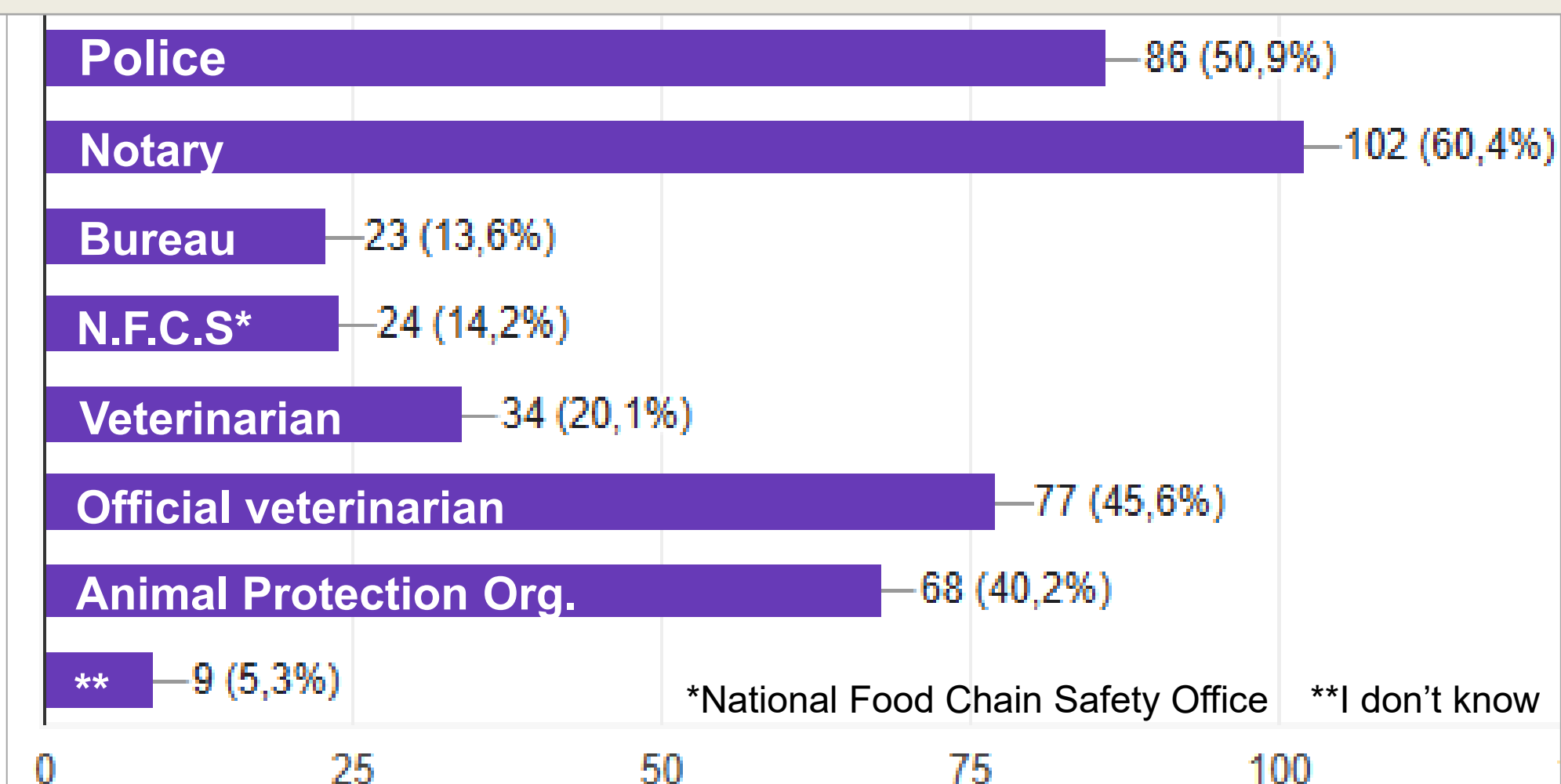
RESULTS & DISCUSSION

- 01 - Powers are not clearly clarified in animal abuse cases
- animal right activist ↔ veterinarian

police officer ↔ lawyer

- The concept of animal abuse is different in administrative law than in criminal law
- Financial problems
- The false reports in force
- High number of unnecessary measures

- 02 - A significant proportion of the respondents are not aware which authority/organization should be contacted
- People would prefer to use reporting options available by phone
